Larry Mobley Memorial Fund

A brief history...

Graham Mobley is the youngest child of four, born to Carol and Larry Mobley in 1971. By the time he was a year old, they realized that Graham's motor skills were far behind that of their other children. Graham underwent numerous tests with a diagnosis of autistic tendencies, mild Cerebral Palsy and moderate mental retardation.

When Graham reached the age of five, Larry Mobley contacted the San Bruno Park School District (SBPSD) about programs that might be available for his son. Due to his Cerebral Palsy, Graham was sent to El Portal del Norte. However, after the first year, the Mobley's and the SBPSD realized that Graham needed a program that would also focus on his learning disability. The SBPSD and the South San Francisco School District worked together to place Graham in a class with other children that shared the same learning disabilities. Graham transferred to other schools, including one in Millbrae and San Mateo.

The SBPSD continued to partner with the Mobley family to find the perfect placement for Graham, which eventually happened when Graham was transferred to the Peninsula Children's Center, a private school located in Menlo Park, where he would spend the remainder of his schools years.

The Larry Mobley Memorial Fund continues Larry's legacy of advocating for parents and children whose lives are affected by both mental and physical disabilities, by providing funding for the special needs

Graham now lives in a group home in the Sacramento area and is working for Pride Industries, a company that provides job for people with disabilities. According to his mom Carol, he loves what he does and looks forward to going to work each day!
